



Get your flu immunisation

Free for people 65 years and over who are eligible* for publicly funded health services.

The influenza vaccine does not protect you from the COVID-19.



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Free flu jab – people aged 65 and over can get vaccinated at their local family doctor (GP) or participating community pharmacist.

If you get an invite/ opportunity to receive the COVID-19 vaccination, you should prioritise this first and get the COVID-19 vaccine before you get the influenza vaccine.

Please note that whilst a two-week gap between influenza and COVID vaccines is recommended there are no clinical safety concerns should the gap between vaccines be less than two weeks.
